Enjoy your trails – but just don't have time to help out?

Homestead Neighborhood Association (with the support of West Willamette Restoration Project and Southwest Neighborhoods Small Grant Program) is making it faster & easier for you to help your local parks (Marquam Nature Park & Terwilliger Parkway) – as well as your neighborhood.

Help "at-risk" native plants by providing them with an 8' circle (4' radius) cleared of the invasive plants that threaten their survival. (Your circle helps them become re-established & protects them until we can clear invasive ivy and blackberries from the area.)

Relax... We make it easy for you to do your part.

Step 1:

Simply select a numbered plant (or plants) that you'd like to help...

Step 2:

Decide on your form of sponsorship... Would you like to clear an 8' (4' radius) invasive-free circle yourself (if so see us...) OR - (if you just don't have the time) would you prefer to provide a tax-deductible donation which will be used to clear the circle for you?

The following list highlights some of the native plants that need a caring sponsor. Following each profile, you can see the sponsorship options – a suggested financial donation OR the estimated effort (in man hours) if you wish to clear the circle yourself. Remember – the “man hours” can be spread over a group – so if you bring a couple of friends – 3 MH – will be over in only 1 ☺ . **Please call 503-245-4009 if you have any questions.**

Location # 2 – Sword Fern hoping for change: Bo is a handsome Sword Fern who appreciates the natural diversity that a healthy ecosystem offers. Help be the change that you want. Provide Bo with an 8' foot circle. (\$45 or 3 MH)

Location # 8 – Everest it's not... Being surrounded by Himalayan Blackberries sounded oh so appropriate, but our Sword Fern Mr. Hillary (and his sidekick Tenzing) assure you that this was not what they expected. Help clear out the invasives that threaten this expedition. (\$30 or 2 MH)

Location # 9 – Plaque (or Plague) Elimination Experience Preferred: Medical or dental professional (or student) sought to eliminate the invasive plants which plague our woods. This Sword Fern will thank you if you schedule a circle-clearing appointment. (\$30 - 2 MH)

Location # 12 – Silent Tree (a trail tradition) : If you know about “silent rock” on the way to Mt. Hood, we need not say more.. While we can't guarantee good luck (or avoidance of bad) we can guarantee that upon completion you'll feel great about what you've accomplished. (\$25 -1.5 MH)

Location #13 - So you like dogs....What about a Maple Doodle? Great temperament, wonderful w/people, sheds only in the fall. Very low maintenance – only needs an 8' circle to thrive. Will repay your kindness by providing shade on your hikes. MY

Location # 16 – Feeling overwhelmed? Maya (a Western Redcedar) may be able to help. On those bad days, simply stop on the trail next to Maya's base and let your eyes travel all the way up to her upper branches and simply breathe. Maya will put things back into perspective. (\$75 or 5MH)

Location # 17 – Ivy League for Serious Ivy Leak: Winston the Sword Fern (Winnie to his friends) is drowning a sea of invasives. He's hoping to find an enlightened and educated sort who understands the environmental advantages that native plants offer... (\$75 or 5MH)

Location # 21 – Better than a Designer Dog: They're everywhere –those shed-free designer dogs. But we can offer better. Our woodland “dogs” (replanted native Red Osier Dogwood) are shed free too – PLUS - and you don't need to clean up after them. :) (\$20 or 1+ MH)

Location # 22 – Lois' Ward: This group of Ferns (Sword / Lady) is looking for some no-nonsense nurses who can clear the some unruly visitors (namely Himalayan Blackberries) who have overstayed their welcome. (But watch out for the replanted natives that are lurking in the shadows.) (\$30 or 2 MH)

Location # 25 - IV Specialists Needed: Pill Hill Sword Fern foursome seeks those with IV experience to help with IVY issues. (\$45 or 3 MH)

Location #30 – Musketeers seeking D'Artagnan: Athos, Porthos and Aramis looking for sponsor with good sword skills to clear circle. (\$45 or 3 MH).

Location # 39 – Free Parking on the Hill? These Sword Ferns knew that would get your attention... While you can't park your car here – they want you to know that you can pull over on the trail at any time, without worrying about a ticket... (\$45 or 3 MH)

Location # 43 – Experimental (non-FDA) Treatment Sought: This group of Sword Ferns is in deep trouble – deep in blackberries that is... They are open to experimental or non-FDA approved circle clearing techniques to regain their health. (\$60 or 4 MH).

Location # 45 – Oregon for Oregonians? Admittedly – Tom (the Oregon Grape) is not the most tactful guy. While he doesn't mind SHARING with out-of state plants, he's tired of these non-natives always taking the best real estate on the forest floor... (\$25 or 1.5 MH)

Location # 34 – Fernheit 451: No book club necessary to interpret this title... \$45 will clear 1 circle. You don't need to be a Guy Montag to make a difference here... (\$45 or 3 MH)

Location # 49 – Brangelina Sighting? No question that Sujah is one of the most adorable orphans in our group. A delicate and beautiful Indian Plum, Sujah offers so much potential... But - if you are interested, you'd better hurry - Brad and Angelina are apparently headed this way. (\$45 or 3 MH)

Location # 52 – Nervous Dentistry Student? Gentle touch not required: Nervous about that first extraction? This patch of re-planted dogwood is being overtaken by blackberries. Practice your extraction techniques – ripping, digging, tearing, yanking allowed. (\$30 or 2 MH)

Location # 55 – The Dog Pound (replanted Red Osier Dogwood): Many of our trail's most enthusiastic users have 4 paws instead of 2 feet. Those paws erode our trails too. Help preserve your dog's favorite trails by sponsoring an 8'circle in our replanted dogwood patch. \$30 or 2 MH)

Location # 57 – These trails are lovely, dark and deep... and a 4' radius is all they need. Please help these Sword Ferns get the protection they need from the invasives.. \$30 or 2.0 MH)

Location # 60 – Shopping for a Cell Phone? Convenient SW Portland location offers free Blackberries to qualified technophiles. No calling plan contract required. (\$25 or 1.5 MH)

Location # 108 – Sugar Daddy Wanted: Bigleaf Maples aren't known for their maple syrup (although their sugar concentration is about the same as the Sugar Maple) but that makes this Maple (and his fern friends) no less sweet & no less deserving of a sponsor (\$60 or 4 MH).

Location # 110 – How do you spell relief? S-A-L-A-L: Salal has been used for its medicinal properties for generations. In the form of a tea salal can apparently relief internal inflammation, stomach ulcers, heartburn, indigestion, moderate fever and yes... even diarrhea. (\$30 or 2 MH)
